

## ORDINANCE 117.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SUPERVISION AND CONTROL OF SEWERS IN THE CITY OF POLSON, CREATING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POLSON:

## SECTION 1.

That the Water Commissioner, or other officer designated by the City Council, of the City of Polson, Montana, Shall the control of the sewers and drains of the said city and everything done and to be done in the premises, to the end that a proper and efficient system of sewerage may be maintained, except as herein otherwise provided.

## SECTION 2.

That Water Commissioner shall, under the direction of the City Council, take the general supervision of all sewers and their connections which are now or may be hereafter built by the city or which may be permitted to be built under its authority, and shall take charge of the building and repairs of the same and all matters in connection with the sewerage of the city, and he shall be ex-officio building inspector within and for the said city

## Section 3.

All sum to be paid by any person or persons for license or permits, as provided for in this ordinance, shall be paid to the city treasurer, taking his receipt therefor, which receipt shall be noted and recorded by the water commissioner before he shall deliver said licenses or permits.

## SECTION 4.

No connection shall be made with any sewers or drains except by persons regularly licensed to perform that description of work, and the person or persons applying for licenses must be resident citizens of the City of Polson, and at the time of the application furnish the city council with a satisfactory certificate, signed by at least two responsible masons, plumbers or builders, or one of each, that the applicant is known to them as a person skilled in the business and qualified to receive a license.

## SECTION 5.

At the time of receiving a license the party shall pay for the same the sum of four dollars and twenty-five cents per quarter, and file a bond in the office of the city clerk in the sum of five hundred dollars, with one or more sureties, to be approved by the mayor and city clerk, conditioned that he will indemnify and save the city harmless from all suits, accidents and damages consequent upon, for or on account of any opening in any street by him or anyone in his employ for making any connection with any public or private sewer or for any other purpose or object whatever, and that he will also replace and restore the street over such opening to as good a condition as he found it; keep guards by day and by night during the progress of such work, and keep and maintain in good order, to the satisfaction of the city water commissioner, and will pay all fines that may be imposed upon him by law.

## SECTION 6.

It is expressly understood that all work performed under this ordinance must be done in accordance with rules and regulation of file in the office of the city water department.

## SECTION 7.

No connection shall be made with any sewer without a permit from the city water commissioner, and no house drain or private sewer will be allowed to be put in place nor any work in connection therewith commenced or prosecuted unless the permit to construct the drain or sewer is in the possession of the licensed drain layer at the site of the proposed work or with

one of his employees engaged in the work; and any opening or connection made into any sewer without such permission or in any manner different from the made prescribed for such openings or connections by this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, subject the person making the same and the occupier or owner of the premises directing it to a penalty of not less than ten dollars and not more than one hundred dollars for each and every day said connection or opening shall remain after notice by the city water commissioner to close and disconnect the same.

SECTION 8.

No permit shall be granted to any person to tap or connect with any sewer off of the line of the street upon which the property is situated.

SECTION 9.

Every house or building shall be separately and independently connected with the public sewer when such sewer is provided, unless a special permit is granted by the city council.

Section 10.

Application for permits may be made by the parties employed to do the work or the owners of the property, and must state the location, the name of the owner, number of the buildings to be connected and now occupied, and a plan shall be deposited with the water commissioner, drawn in ink to a scale which shall show the whole course of the drain from the connection with the sewer to its terminus within the building line. All applications must be accompanied by the treasurer's receipt for one dollar for each connection, to cover the expense of inspection and of making out and filing in the city water commissioner's office a plan of the connection.

SECTION 11.

Any person licensed to make connections with sewers and drains who shall be guilty of a violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be immediately deprived of his license or fined as above provided, or both, in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 12.

In the opinion of the city council the passage of this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety and an emergency is therefore declared to exist; and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. 118

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE DIFFERENT FUNDS IN AND FOR THE CITY OF POLSON, MONTANA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF POLSON, MONTANA:

SECTION 1. That there be and is hereby created for the various departments of the City of Polson the following funds, to-wit:- General Fund, Street Fund, Street lighting Fund, Water Fund, Sinking Fund, Library Fund, Park Fund, Contingent Fund, Police Department Fund, Fire Department Fund, Poor Fund, and Special Fund.

SECTION 2. All taxes collected for general purposes shall be paid into the general fund; all taxes collected for street purposes shall be paid into the street fund, all moneys collected for City Licenses shall be paid into the Street Lighting Fund; all revenues collected for water purposes shall be paid into the Water Fund; all taxes collected for sinking purposes shall be paid into the sinking Fund; All taxes collected for library purposes shall be paid into the Library Fund; all taxes collected for park shall be paid into the Park Fund; all taxes collected for contingent purposes shall be paid into the contingent fund; all taxes collected for police purposes shall be paid into the Police Department fund; all taxes collected for fire purposes shall be paid into the Fire Department Fund; and all donations made to and by the city for the benefit of the poor shall be paid into the Poor Fund; all moneys collected by special assessment for sewer purposes, sidewalks purposes or money collected for any other purpose by special assessment shall be paid into the Special Fund;

SECTION 3. That every warrant drawn upon the city treasurer shall designate the fund out of which the same is to be paid, and shall be paid only out of moneys belonging to the fund so designated unless otherwise ordered by the City Council.

SECTION 4. The City Treasurer of the City of Polson shall keep each and every fund separate and apart from the other funds of the city.

SECTION 5. All funds collected by the police magistrate as fines for violations of City Ordinances and the City pound receipts shall be paid into the Police Department Fund.

SECTION 6. Receipts from Poll taxes as provided for in Ordinance No. 10 of the City of Polson shall be paid into the Street lighting in Fund.
