

ORDINANCE NUMBER 26.

An Ordinance fixing the official Bonds of the City Treasurer, City Clerk, City Attorney, Chief of Police and Police Judge.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Polson.

Section 1 - That the City Treasurer, the City Clerk, the City Attorney, Chief of Police and Police Judge shall each execute to the City of Polson, a good and sufficient bond, with two or more sureties or a surety company bond, to be approved by the City Council; conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of their respective offices, that they shall account for all moneys and property belonging to the city coming into their hands by virtue of their respective offices.

Section 2 - The bond of the City Treasurer shall be in the sum of Three Thousand (\$3000.00) Dollars; The Bond of the City Clerk shall be in the sum of One Thousand (1000.00) Dollars; The bond of the City Attorney shall be in the sum of One Thousand (1000.00) Dollars; The bond of the Chief of Police shall be in the sum of Two Thousand (\$2000.00) Dollars and the bond of the Police Judge shall be in the sum of One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars.

Section 3 - All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4 - Whereas an emergency exists and it is immediately necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and public safety, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately.
