

## O R D I N A N C E N O. 6.

An Ordinance to provide for the boundaries of the city limits, of the city of Polson.


BE it ordained by the council of the city of Polson.

Section 1. The boundaries of the city limits are, until the same shall be changed in pursuance of law, as follows to-wit: beginning at the (quarter corner) of the South West corner, of the Southwest quarter, of Section 4, Township 22 North, of Range 20 West of the principal meridian of Montana, and running North  $0^{\circ}17'$  East 1539.3 feet, thence North  $21^{\circ}16'$  East 261.4 feet, thence North  $54^{\circ}30'$  East 180 feet, thence North  $74^{\circ}10'$  East 293.1 feet, thence North  $48^{\circ}$  East 249.5 feet, thence North  $43^{\circ}27'$  East 293.4 feet, thence North  $21^{\circ}34'$  East 347.8 feet, thence North  $40^{\circ}$  East 236. feet, thence North  $78^{\circ}51'$  East 210.8 feet, thence South  $75^{\circ}$  East 530 feet, thence South  $32^{\circ}44'$  East 108.2 feet, thence South  $2647^{\circ}4'$  feet, thence North  $89^{\circ}37'$  West 1984. feet, to the place of beginning to be known as the original city of Polson.

Section 2. For the purpose of regulating and controlling the shores and waters bordering upon the said city of Polson, the said city of Polson hereby extends its corporate limits five hundred feet below the meander line toward, over, upon and across the said waters, and the ordinances of the city of Polson, are hereby made applicable to govern the same.

Section 3. Whereas, an emergency exists and it is immediately necessary for the preservation, peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Polson, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval according to law.
