

## O. R D I N A N C E NO. 63.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR DEFACING OR INJURING ANY BILL OR POSTER OF ENTERTAINMENT LICENSED BY THE CITY OF POLSON.

: Be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Polson:

To destroy or mutilate bills or posters, a misdemeanor. It shall not be lawful for any person to destroy, tear, mutilate, cover over or otherwise deface or injure any bill or poster (posted in such places as may be permitted), descriptive of any performance or entertainment given by any licensed theater or hall, or in pursuance of any license given by the City of Polson; and any person or persons violating the provisions of this section shall be subject to a penalty of twenty five dollars for each and every violation thereof.
