

ORDINANCE NO. 66.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF BUILDINGS TO DISTURB THE PEACE, OR DANGEROUS OR DETRIMENTAL TO HEALTH.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Polson:

Use of buildings to disturb the peace prohibited. No person owning or occupying any building or premises shall use the same, or permit the use of the same, or rent the same, to be used for any business or employment or for any purpose of pleasure or recreation, if such use shall, from its boisterous nature, disturb or destroy the peace of the neighborhood in which such building or premises are situated, or be dangerous or detrimental to health.
