O R D I N A N C E N O. 83

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION, MANAGEMENT, IMPROVEMENT AND USE OF LAKE SHORE LANDS ABUTTING UPON THE STREETS, ALLEYS OR PARKS BELONGING TO THE CITY OF POLSON.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Polson.

SECTION 1. The lake shore lands lying between low water mark and high water mark and abutting upon the streets, alleys or parks of the City of Polson shall be under the supervision of the City Marshal who shall regulate the public and private use of the same in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. All such lands are hereby declared to be free and open to public use for access to and from the waters of Flathead Lake, except where the use of any portion of said land may be granted to any individual or corporation under the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. Any person desiring to use any portion of said land for the construction of docks, wharves, warehouses, or for other purposes shall file an application in writing with the City Council stating the amount of land desired, the location of the same, and the purpose for which the land is to be used.

SECTION 4. All applications for the privilege of using such land shall be considered by the City Council at the first regular meeting after when considered the same have been filed, and where two or more applications are made for the same site, preference shall be given to the application which is first in point of time.

SECTION 5. Any person or corporation having improved any of said land by the construction of buildings, docks or wharves prior to the passage of this ordinance, shall be allowed thirty days from the final enactment of this ordinance during which time said person or corporation shall have the exclusive right to apply for the use of such land so occupied.

SECTION 6. Any person or corporation maintaining any building dock or wharf for public hire shall fix a uniform scale of charges, which charges shall be reasonable and shall be enforced against all patrons alike without discrimination.

SECTION 7. The City Council hereby expressly reserves the right to regulate and fix the rates that may be charged for the use of docks, wharves or other improvements, but such right may not be exercised by the Council so long as the rates fixed by the owners of such docks, wharves or improvements are reasonable and fair, and failure to exercise such right by the City Council shall not be deemed a relinquishment of such right.

SECTION 8. Whenever the City Council shall grant a permit for the use of any of said land, the City Treasurer shall issue a written permit or license which shall contain a description of the land covered by the permit, and the purpose for which the same are granted, and such permit shall continue in force so long as the party to whom the same is granted shall comply with all the rules and regulations fixed by the City Council.

SECTION 9. Each person or corporation to whom a permit for the use of land is granted shall pay for the use of such land the sum of \$1.00 per annum for each front foot of land covered by such permit. Said sum to be paid to the City Treasurer in equal installments semi-annually on the first day of April, and the first day of October of each year, and no permit or license shall be issued until the first installment for the same has been paid.

SECTION 10. Each holder of a permit shall have the right to assign and transfer the same and thereafter the license shall be carried in the name of the party to whom the same is transferred who will be bound by the rules and regulations the same as the original holder of the license.

SECTION 11. Any person who shall obstruct, in any manner, any portion of the lake shore abutting the streets, alleys or parks of the City of Polson without first securing a permit as provided in this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than \$25.00 or more than \$100.00.

SECTION 12. Every person or corporation to whom a permit is granted for the use of land shall improve and operate the same in accordance with directions and under the supervision of the City Engineer, and any failure to comply with this provision shall be deemed cause sufficient for the revocation of such permit.

SECTION 13. There is hereby created a City Fund to be known as the Harbor Fund, and all sums received for permits to use said lake shore lands shall be placed in said fund, and the same shall be used for improving the water front, and the roads leading to and from the same.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND FIXING THE SALARIES OF THE APPOINTIVE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF POLSON, MONTANA.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Polson:

SECTION I. The compensation of the City Clerk, City Treasurer, City Attorney, Police Judge, Health Officer, Street Salaries Commissioner, Chief of Police, Chief of the Fire Department, Policemen and Firemen is hereby fixed and established at the following named salaries; That the same shall be accepted and taken as full compensation for all services to be rendered by said officers for the City of Polson, Montana until changed by ordinance.

City Clerk, per annum -----	\$ 360.00
City Treasurer " " -----	100.00
Health Officer " " -----	100.00
Chief of Police and Street Comm- issioner per annum -----	720.00
Chief of Fire Dept, per call ---	2.00
Firemen, per call -----	1.00
Policemen, each per day -----	3.00

SECTION 2. The said several salaries shall be paid at the end of each month, by warrant, issued and drawn by order of the Mayor and City Council, according to law.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

SECTION 4. All ordinances and parts thereof, so far as they may conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
