ORDINANCE NO. 92.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2 OF ORDINANCE NO. 87, " An ordinance to provide for the establishment of fire limits, to regulate the erection and construction of buildings within the City of Polson, and to provide a penalty for the violation of the same."

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Polson, Montana:

SECTION 1. That henceforth no person without special permit from the city Council shall within said fire limits, as described in Section I. of Ordinance No. 87, construct or erect, or cause to be constructed or erected, any other building than one substantially fire proof: that is to say that the exterior walls thereof shall be of stone, brick or other non-combustible material, and the roof thereof shall be of tin, iron, slate or other material equally fire-proof.

Wooden buildings covered on the outer side with brick, iron or tin shall not be considered made of non-combustible material within the meaning of this ordinance, nor shall any person within the said fire limits, without similar permit from the City Council, rebuild or repair beyond what is necessary to make good any ordinary or natural deterioration, enlarge or add to any wooden building now standing within said fire limits, or to the roof thereof, or remove or cause to be removed any wooden building from one lot to another within said limits, And in no case, except by permission from the City Council, shall the interior walls or ceilings of any building now in course of construction or erection, or hereafter to be erected or constructed within said fire limits, be of cloth or have cloth tacked thereon or stretched thereacross. Any person whether owner, leasee, contractor or laborer, who shall hereafter in violation of the provisions of this ordinance, erect, repair, enlarge, or remove any such prohibited wooden structure, roof or ceiling, or cause the same to be done by others, shall be deemed to have committed a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than twenty five (\$25) dollars nor more than one hundred (\$100) dollars, and such structures erected in violation of this ordinance are hereby declared to be a nuisance, and it shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to require the author of such nuisance to remove the same forthwith, and if the said author shall neglect or refuse to abate the same, or signify his intentions to do so within twenty four hours after notice, it shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to do so, and the costs thereof shall be charged to and may be recovered from the owner of the property by suit in the name of the city in any court of competent jurisdiction.

SECTION 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. It being deemed best for the peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Polson, this ordinance shall be in full force, immediately upon its passage and approval according to law.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SPRINKLING OF STREETS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF POLSON, MONTANA, AND PROVIDING A METHOD OF DOING SAID WORK AND PAYING FOR THE SAME.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Polson, Montana;

SECTION 1. That during the months of July, August and September

SECTION 2. There shall be levied each year a special tax on
How paid the property bordering on the streets, alleys and for. public places, sprinkled, which shall be determined by dividing the total cost of sprinkling the same by the total number of linear feet of the property in front of, or bordering which sprinkling has been done, and each lot or parcel of land shall be assessed for as many linear feet as border on any street that has been sprinkled.

SECTION 3. A resolution dividing the whole or any part of the
Sprinkling city into sprinkling districts, to be known and des- districts, ignedated by number, shall be passed; said resolution now formed. shall plainly define the boundaries of the several districts, or enumerate the streets, alleys and public places, or any part thereof, constituting the the different districts.

SECTION 4. When once defined, sprinkling districts shall not be changed during the same calender year, but may be changed by resolution the following year, or any year thereafter.

SECTION 5. The sprinkling in the districts so established may
How sprink- city, or both, in such manner as the council may elect, ling may be and it shall be the duty of said council to estimate, done. as near as practicable, the cost of sprinkling in such districts so established for the season, and before the first Monday in October of each year they shall pass and finally adopt a resolution levying and assessing all the property within the several districts with an amount equal to not less than seventy five per cent of the entire cost of said work, exclusive of the cost of sprinkling parks and public places.
