O R D I N A N C E N O. 93

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SPRINKLING OF STREETS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF POLSON, MONTANA, AND PROVIDING A METHOD OF DOING SAID WORK AND PAYING FOR THE SAME.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Polson, Montana;

SECTION 1. That during the months of July, August and September  
What places) of each year, and such other times as the Council  
shall be ( shall deem necessary, such streets, alleys and  
sprinkled ) public places, or portions thereof as may hereafter  
and when. ( be designated by resolution passed by the city  
) council, shall be sprinkled.

SECTION 2. There shall be levied each year a special tax on  
How paid the property bordering on the streets, alleys and  
for. public places, sprinkled, which shall be determined  
by dividing the total cost of sprinkling the same  
by the total number of linear feet of the property  
in front of, or bordering which sprinkling has been done, and  
each lot or parcel of land shall be assessed for as many linear  
feet as border on any street that has been sprinkled.

SECTION 3. A resolution dividing the whole or any part of the  
Sprinkling city into sprinkling districts, to be known and des-  
districts, igned by number, shall be passed; said resolution  
how formed. shall plainly define the boundaries of the several  
districts, or enumerate the streets, alleys and  
public places, or any part thereof, constituting the  
the different districts.

SECTION 4. When once defined, sprinkling districts shall not  
be changed during the same calendar year, but may  
be changed by resolution the following year, or any  
year thereafter.

SECTION 5. The sprinkling in the districts so established may  
be done by contract or by forces employed by the  
How sprink- city, or both, in such manner as the council may elect,  
ling may be and it shall be the duty of said council to estimate,  
done. as near as practicable, the cost of sprinkling in  
such districts so established for the season, and  
before the first Monday in October of each year they  
shall pass and finally adopt a resolution levying and assessing  
all the property within the several districts with an amount  
equal to not less than seventy five per cent of the entire cost  
of said work, exclusive of the cost of sprinkling parks and  
public places.

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SECTION 6. The resolution levying the assessment to defray the cost of sprinkling shall contain a list in which shall be described the lot or parcel of land assessed, with the name of the owner thereof, if known, and the amount levied thereon set opposite; such resolution shall be kept on file in the office of the City Clerk and a notice signed by the city clerk, stating that the resolution levying special assessment to defray the cost of sprinkling in the several districts is on file in his office and subject to inspection for a period of five days, shall be published at least once in a newspaper published in the city; such notice shall state the time and place at which objections to the final adoption of such resolution will be heard by the council, and the time of such hearing shall be not less than five days after the publication of such notice; At the time so set, the council shall meet at their regular place of meeting and hear all objections which may be made to such assessment, or any part thereof, and may adjourn from time to time for that purpose, and may by resolution, modify such resolution in whole or in part.

A copy of such resolution, certified by the clerk, must be delivered to the county treasurer on or before the first Monday in October of each year, and such assessment shall be placed upon the tax roll, and collected in the same manner as other taxes.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after thirty days after its passage and approval.
