



in and about his premises for the space of three days shall be deemed to be the possessor or harbinger of said dog.

#### O R D I N A N C E N O. 10.

An Ordinance providing for the levy and collection of a Poll tax of two dollars, upon all male able bodied residents of the City of Polson between the ages of twenty-one and forty-five years old.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Polson.

Section 1. There is hereby levied on every able-bodied male person between the ages of twenty-one and forty-five years residing within the limits of the City of Polson, and annual poll tax of two dollars, for street and alley purposes, to be paid either in money or in work upon the streets and alleys under the supervision of the Street Commissioner. It is the duty of the City Treasurer to collect the same.

Section 2. The City Clerk must make a list of all persons liable for the payment of poll tax in this city, and present the same to the City Council, for inspection and correction at a regular or special meeting to be held in October 1910, and for every year hereafter not later than the third Monday of May. On or before the first regular meeting of the council in June, the Council must direct a copy of said list, as corrected, certified to the City Treasurer, and the City Treasurer must forthwith collect such taxes from the persons name in the list, and from such other persons as are liable for the same.

Poll tax for the year 1910, are payable from every male resident immediately as set forth in section One of this Ordinance.


Section 3. As soon as a certified copy of the corrected list, approved by the City Council, with the names of the male persons liable to poll tax, is delivered to the Treasurer, he shall forthwith ~~provide~~ to <sup>the</sup> collect of such tax. He shall demand the same once from every person names in the list, and if any person neglects to pay the same for ten days thereafter, he shall deliver to the Street Commissioner a list of the names of the persons failing to pay such tax, for the Streets of the City. ALL money collected for p poll tax shall be placed to the credit of the Street fund.

Section 4. Any person who refuses or neglects to pay said poll tax after being notified by the Street Commissioner, shall by the said Commissioner be reported to the City Clerk, who shall certify the same to the County Treasurer, against their real and personal property, to be by ~~the~~ County Treasurer collected, and place to the credit of the Street and alley funds of the city of Polson, and collected by said County Treasurer the same as other taxes.

Section 5. All acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Whereas, an emergency exists and it is immediately necessary for the preservation, peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Polson, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval according to law.
