

RESOLUTION NO. 17

Whereas, the citizens and owners of Church Addition to the City of Polson, Montana are desirous of being annexed to and form a part of the City of Polson, and

Whereas, it appearing to the City Council that it will be to the best interests of the City of Polson and the inhabitants of the Church Addition; that the said addition and territory embraced therein be included with the corporate limits of the City of Polson,

Be it therefore Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Polson that it is the judgment of the City Council that it will be to the best interest of the City of Polson and the inhabitants of the Church Addition to said City that the boundaries of said City of Polson be extended so as to include within the corporate limits of the City of Polson all territory embraced within said Church Addition.

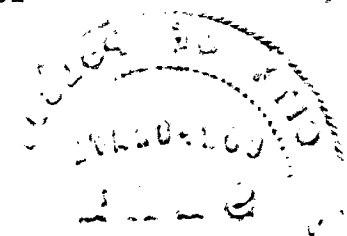
The description of the land embraced in the Church Addition being as follows: beginning at the southeast corner of lot twelve (12), block sixteen (16) of the original Townsite of Polson, Montana and running east 145.2 feet; thence north 300 feet; thence west 145.2 feet; thence south 300 feet to the point of beginning.
