

ORDINANCE NO. 240

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING A METHOD FOR SPRINKLING THE STREETS EMBRACED WITHIN SPRINKLING DISTRICT NO. 14-J, PAYING FOR THE SAME AND CREATING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POLSON, MONTANA.

SECTION 1. That all the streets included within oil sprinkling district No. 14-J shall be oiled during the summer season of 1952 by forces employed by the City of Polson.

SECTION 2, That the cost and expense of sprinkling said streets with oil shall be assessed against all of the property, exclusive of public parks and public places, embraced within such oil sprinkling district upon an area basis.

SECTION 3. WHEREAS, an emergency exists, and it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the public that this ordinance take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

RESOLUTION NO. 130

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Honorable Mayor and the City Council of the City of Polson, Montana, in regular meeting assembled, that

Whereas, petitions are now being circulated for an initiative measure to amend the Workmen's Compensation Law of the State of Montana in many respects, and

Whereas, such amendments would place a tremendous and unreasonable burden on the economy of the entire State of Montana and this community, and would serve to discourage new industry coming in and drive present industry from this state thereby creating more unemployment, and

Whereas, such burden would fall not on industry alone but on all state, county and municipal bodies and all taxpayers of this state, and that additional taxes in some unknown but extremely large amount would be required to finance such a program, and that all governmental activities would necessarily have to be curtailed because of such financial load, and

Whereas, many state, county and municipal officials and employees are covered by the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act, and are therefore vitally interested in it, and

Whereas, many persons have been and are now being asked to sign such petitions without have a complete and full understanding of the measure and the bad effects it would have on both employers and employee,
