2014 – 2015 Special Assessment Statistics

<u>SID #42 Assessment</u> – Created by Resolution No. 955 & 975. There are 57 property owners assessed for this fiscal year which is the same as the prior year. There were no payoffs during FY14. The assessment has been calculated to ensure payment of the debt service – taking into account possible delinquent assessments. There are 22 installments left on the loan with a balance of \$584,701.24.

<u>Street Light Maintenance District #19 (Residential District)</u> – Created by Resolution No. 252. The assessment remains the same for FY15. The fund still has good cash reserves so there was no need to raise the assessment. Electric costs continue to increase and the assessment will need to be re-evaluated at the end of FY15. There are a total of 1,367 properties assessed.

<u>Street Light Maintenance District #20 (Business District)</u> – Created by Resolution No. 253. The assessment remains the same for FY15. The fund still has adequate cash reserves so there was no need to raise the assessment. Electric costs continue to increase and the assessment will need to be re-evaluated at the end of FY15. The City contributes 60% of the cost for this District and the property owners contribute 40%. There are a total of 99 properties assessed.

<u>Noxious Weed Control Maintenance</u> – Allowed under Title 7, Chapter 7.06 of the Polson Municipal Code. This year 31 certified letters were sent to property owners and 6 properties are being assessed as a result of those letters. Last year there were a total of 7 assessments.

<u>Delinquent Utility Bills</u> - Allowed by Section 7-13-4309 MCA. There are a total of 6 assessments in FY15 for delinquent utility bills that meet the criteria to be placed as a tax on the property.

The total assessed properties for FY15 are 1,535.
