Sec. 2.05.520. - Members; appointment and terms.
All appointments to a board created pursuant to this division will be made by the city commission.
A board created pursuant to this division shall consist of at least five members with the initial terms as follows: one member appointed for one year, one for two years, two for three years, and the fifth member for four years. Each appointment thereafter shall be for four years. A certificate of the appointment or reappointment of a commissioner must be filed with the clerk of the municipality, and the certificate is conclusive evidence of the proper appointment of the commissioner.

The city commission may determine in the resolution or ordinance creating the board that some positions must be filled by persons with specific backgrounds, expertise, or experiences, while other positions may be at large.

Each board member shall hold office until the board member's successor has been appointed and has qualified.

A board member shall receive no compensation for the board member's services, but shall be entitled to previously authorized expenses, including travelling expenses, incurred in the discharge of the board member's duties.

Any porsons may be appointed as board mombers if they resido within the municipality. At least four of the five members shall be residents of the city. A non-resident member of the board shall have some interest in the city by virtue of working in the city or owning property in the city.

A board member may be removed for inefficiency, neglect of duty or misconduct in office, or as provided for by law.
