**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Commission of the City of Polson, Montana that the following assessments be levied for the fiscal year 2023-2024.

## 2023 - 2024 Special Assessment Statistics

Special Improvement District (SID) #42 Assessment- This district was created by Resolution No. 955 & 975. This is for Main Street Improvements, which include the sidewalks, bulb outs, trees, landscaping, and lighting. There are 51 property owners assessed for this district. There were no payoffs in FY23. The assessment has been calculated to ensure payment of the debt service, as well as, considering possible delinquent assessments. There are 4 installments left on the loan with a current principal balance of \$100,087.50. Final debt service payment is due 07/01/2025. The proposed FY24 assessment is \$65,603.17, which covers the semi-annual payments due. This assessment be paid off 7/01/2025.

<u>Street Light Maintenance District /t19 (Residential District)</u> - This district was created by Resolution No. 252 and there are a total of 1,383 properties assessed for this district. The FY24 assessment is based on the annual electric cost in this district (which is \$17,971.20) and operating reserves. The proposed FY24 assessment is \$21,462.88. This levy is renewed each year, and the levy pays the expenses.

Street Light Maintenance District #20 (Business District)-This district was created by Resolution No. 253 and there are a total of 98 properties assessed for this district. The total projected cost for the district for FY24 is \$8,188.00. Of the total cost, the City contributes 60% of the cost for this District and the property owners contribute 40%. The proposed FY24 assessment is \$3,275.00. This levy is renewed each year, and the levy just pays the expenses.

<u>Noxious Weed Control Maintenance</u> - Allowed under Section 7.02.020 of the Polson Municipal Code. No assessments for this year.

<u>Delinquent Utility Bills</u> - Allowed by Section 7-13-4309 MCA. There are eight properties that meet the criteria for placing the delinquent utility account as a tax lien to be paid through the property tax billing process. The total amount of assessments is \$15,047.37.
